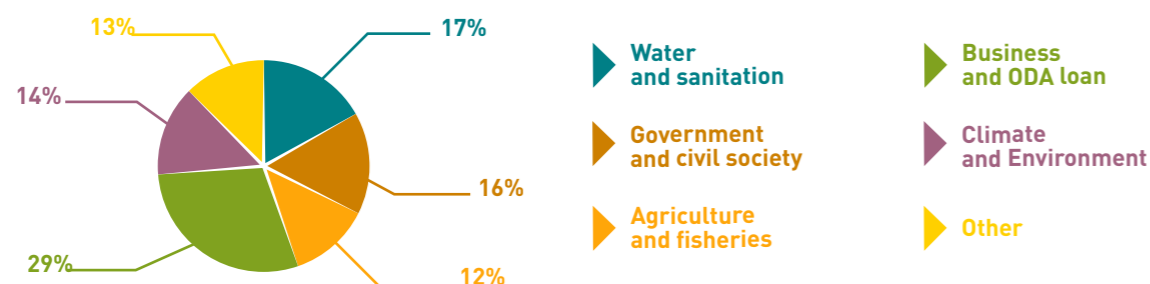

COUNTRY MESSAGE

“Traditional Danish development assistance will be phased out by 2015. However continued support is expected within governance, climate, energy and culture.

Non-ODA support: The following four priorities will guide future cooperation between Denmark and Vietnam.

Political and diplomatic cooperation: Vietnam and Denmark will increase exchange on political and diplomatic cooperation, including exchange on issues such as human rights protection and governance.

Trade and investment cooperation: Denmark and Vietnam agree to strengthen bilateral trade and commercial cooperation. The two sides will create favourable conditions for the establishment and operation of Danish and Vietnamese enterprises on the two markets.

Climate, energy, environment and green growth: Vietnam and Denmark agree to promote activities and initiatives in climate, energy security, environment protection, water resource management and green growth.

Culture and people to people links: Denmark and Vietnam will further strengthen exchange in the fields of arts and culture as well as encourage direct cooperation between Danish and Vietnamese cultural institutions.”
